

ISMA CODING CORNER



We all know now the world did not end on October 1, 2015, with the implementation of ICD-10-CM. As CMAs, we take a deep breath, jump in, and master a new skill, as we have done with ICD-10-CM.

One thing that has not changed is the sequencing of diagnostic codes. In outpatient/physician billing, the *first-listed diagnosis* is the main reason for the patient encounter, taking the majority of resources for the visit. It is also listed first for the visit to inform the insurance company of the primary reason for the patient to seek treatment for that visit. This may be a sign, symptom, or a diagnosed disease or condition.

Sign – Visible evidence that the physician can determine objectively (overactive bowel sounds, laceration to the skin)

Symptom – A subjective, descriptive term, usually in the patient's own words (pain, lethargy)

Signs and symptoms are coded until a definitive diagnosis is made. If symptoms are presented leading to a diagnosis, then only the diagnosis is coded. For example, chest congestion, fever, cough may be symptoms related to a diagnosis of bronchial pneumonia (J18.0).

ICD-10-CM has many codes for pneumonia based on descriptive types. Examples given are just a few of these:

Aspiration pneumonia in a newborn – P24.81

Pneumonia due to inhalation of fumes, vapors, chemicals – J68.0

Staphylococcus pneumonia (MRSA) – J15.212

Staphylococcus pheumoma (MKSA) – J15.212

Influenza with pneumonia – J11.00

Acute pneumonia – J18.9

It is important to code symptoms until a diagnosis is determined. For example, symptoms of increased thirst with urination, tiredness, sores that do not heal, can be related to diabetes. Until testing is performed and results evaluated by the physician, symptoms should be coded until the documentation Is entered into the medical record as a disease process.
