# ISMA CODING CORNER

A major focus in medical coding now is ICD-10-CM as we all prepare for October 1, 2015. The table below gives a comparison of ICD-9-CM codes and ICD-10-CM codes.

# Comparison between ICE-9-CM and ICD-10-CM

ICD-9-CM	ICD-10-CM
Consists of three to five characters	Consists of three to seven characters
Approximately 14, 500 codes (including V and E codes)	Approximately 70,000 codes
First character is numeric or alpha (E or V) or numeric; characters 2-5 are numeric	First character is alpha: characters 2 and 3 are numeric: characters 4-7 are alpha or numeric
Always at least three characters	Flexible for adding new codes; very specific
Decimal placed after the first 3 characters	Decimal placed after the first 3 characters
No laterality	Has laterality



# INDIANA STATE MEDICAL ASSOCIATION REPORTS

The failure of two major bills during legislature session, Bills SB.55 and HB.1043 would have greatly impacted medical malpractice premiums and threatened access and quality of care for thousands of Hoosiers. This illustrates the importance of physician involvement.

The ISMA knows about the costs of medication and is advising Indiana residents about the Indiana Drug Card Program. This program is HIPPA compliant and requires disclosure of No personal information and works for anyone without prescription coverage, as well as anyone who has a high deductible plan, high co-pays or a health savings account (HSA), as a way to reduce the costs of medications.

Report card shows Indiana could do more to curb tobacco use; Tobacco prevention/control program funding, Tobacco Taxes and Access to cessation services all reported a Grade F. Smoke free air reported a Grade C. Help patients stop smoking by encouraging them to use the free Indiana Tobacco Quitline by calling 1-800-QUIT-NOW (800-784-8669). Smokers can talk to experienced professional coaches trained in cognitive behavioral therapy. E-cigarettes are becoming increasingly popular as an alternative to tobacco. # Eating Outdoors, Handling Food Safely

# Pack and Transport Food Safely

### Keep your food safe: from the refrigerator/freezer . . .

all the way to the picnic table.

- Keep cold food cold. Place cold food in a cooler with ice or frozen gel packs. Cold food should be stored at 40°F or below to prevent bacterial growth. Meat, poultry, and seafood may be packed while still frozen so that they stay colder longer.
- **Organize cooler contents.** Consider packing beverages in one cooler and perishable foods in another. That way, as picnickers open and reopen the *beverage* cooler to replenish their drinks, the *perishable foods* won't be exposed to warm outdoor air temperatures.
- **Keep coolers closed.** Once at the picnic site, limit the number of times the cooler is opened as much as you can. This helps to keep the contents cold longer.
- **Don't cross-contaminate.** Be sure to keep raw meat, poultry, and seafood securely wrapped. This keeps their juices from contaminating prepared/cooked foods or foods that will be eaten raw, such as fruits and vege-tables.
- Clean your produce. Rinse fresh fruits and vegetables under running tap water before packing them in the cooler including those with skins and rinds that are not eaten. Rub firm-skinned fruits and vegetables under running tap water or scrub with a clean vegetable brush while rinsing with running tap water. Dry fruits and vegetables with a clean cloth towel or paper towel.— Packaged fruits and vegetables that are labeled "ready-to-eat," "washed," or "triple washed" need not be washed.

# Follow Safe Grilling Tips

Grilling and picnicking often go hand-in-hand. And just as with cooking indoors, there are important guidelines that should be followed to ensure that your **grilled food** reaches the table **safely**.

- **Marinate safely.** Marinate foods in the refrigerator *never* on the kitchen counter or outdoors. In addition, if you plan to use some of the marinade as a sauce on the cooked food, *reserve a portion separately* before add-ing the raw meat, poultry, or seafood. **Don't reuse marinade**.
- **Cook immediately after "partial cooking."** If you partially cook food to reduce grilling time, do so *immediately before* the food goes on the hot grill.
- **Cook food thoroughly.** When it's time to cook the food, have your food thermometer ready. Always use it to be sure your food is cooked thoroughly.
- **Keep "ready" food hot.** Grilled food can be kept hot until served by moving it to the side of the grill rack, just away from the coals. This keeps it hot but prevents overcooking.
- **Don't reuse platters or utensils.** Using the same platter or utensils that previously held raw meat, poultry, or seafood allows bacteria from the raw food's juices to spread to the cooked food. Instead, have a clean platter and utensils ready at grill-side to serve your food. Fda.gov

Take I-465 East to the Brookville Road (Hwy 52) Exit 47. Turn right (East) onto Brookville Road. Go through one stoplight. Turn left at the second light and right onto the road behind the gas station. This leads into the school parking lot. Enter the building at the door on the far right.
