ISMA Corner:

The Indiana Prescription Drug Abuse Prevention Task Force was created in 2012 by Indiana's Attorney General Greg Zoeller and he continues to serve as co-chair. The Task Force was created to bring all the different stakeholders – law enforcement, the medical community, policy makers – to the table so they could come up with real, comprehensive solutions to address the challenging issues of the opioid epidemic, reduce prescription drug abuse and ultimately save Hoosier lives. One of the first missions of the Task Force was to find ways to encourage safe pain management. The CDC lists Indiana among the top 10 states where the highest amount of opioid painkillers are prescribed.

Experts and medical professionals on the Task Force have created a toolkit for physicians (www.ismanet.org/go/BPtooklit) on safe effective management of chronic pain, with an emphasis on improving functionality rather than masking pain. The kit helped inform development of updated opioid prescribing rules by the Medical Licensing Board in 2014. All physicians are urged to use INSPECT, the state's prescribing database, to be sure patients are not "doctor shopping and at risk for addiction."

The Task Force will continue to focus on increasing access to integrated addiction treatment programs as well as encouraging wider use of INSPECT. Also an important part since its formation is Public Education about the prevalence and dangers of prescription drug abuse, especially since a national drug survey reported 55 percent of abusers say they get their drugs from friends and family.

The Indiana State Medical Association continues to work with the Task Force and other stakeholders to improve on Indiana's opioid epidemic.

ISMA CODING CORNER

If you did not attend the February 20 ISMA workshop, you missed a great speaker and a topic on her area of expertise: genetic cancer risk assessment.

Cindy Hunter, MS, CGC, is a licensed genetic counselor at Indiana University Health Physicians' Department of Medical and Molecular Genetics. Her presentation included history and statistics of all cancers, but in particular, breast, ovarian, and colorectal cancers.

Genetic testing is the analysis of a particular gene, looking for a change in the gene which causes it to be non-functional (e.g., a mutation). Genetic testing and counseling are becoming more prevalent as individuals with a personal or family history features suggestive of a genetic cancer susceptibility condition seek information relative to that hereditary condition, any associated genetic factors, and available medical management options.

We are reminded that cancer is caused by multiple factors acting together or in sequence.

External factors: Tobacco use, infectious organisms, unhealthy diet

Internal factors: Inherited genetic mutations, hormones and immune conditions

Current Procedural Terminology (CPT) contains multiple test panels for genetic testing located under Molecular Pathology in the Pathology/Laboratory section. Some of the more common ones are as follows:

BRCA1 specific site analysis – CPT code range 81211, 81213, 81215, 81217

BRCA Ashkenazi Jewish founder mutations (a panel of 3 specific mutations accounting for the vast majority of hereditary breast and ovarian cancer in this population group) – CPT code ranges 81211, 81212, 81213

BRCA1 specific site – when the familial mutation has already been identified in the family - CPT code – 81215

BRCA2 specific site - CPT code 81217

Lynch Syndrome – the most common hereditary colorectal cancer syndrome – CPT code range – 81292, 81295, 81298, 81294, 81297, 81300, 81403, 81317, 81319

APC and MYH – the most common forms of hereditary colon polyposis (a condition characterized by the presence of numerous internal polyps, especially a hereditary disease (familial adenomatous

polyposis) that affects the colon and in which the polyps may become malignant) – CPT code range for APC 81201, 81203; for MYH 81403

As always in coding, code selection is based on medical documentation related to a specific site, condition, and/or diagnosis.

My thanks to Cindy Hunter for this presentation as well as her contribution in providing CPT codes for these test panels for this article.


