- B. PRESIDENT: It shall be the duty of the President to preside at all meetings of this Society and of its Board of Directors. The President shall appoint a Parliamentary advisor, Historian, and Corresponding Secretary, whose duty shall be to conduct the correspondence of the Society. The President shall appoint standing and special committees, not otherwise set forth in these Bylaws. The President shall be ex-officio member of every Indiana Society Committee except the Nominating Committee and is to perform such other duties as ordinarily pertain to this office, not otherwise covered in these Bylaws.

PROPOSED

- B. PRESIDENT: It shall be the duty of the President to preside at all meetings of this Society and of its Board of Directors. The President shall appoint a Parliamentary advisor, Historian, and Corresponding Secretary, whose duty shall be to conduct the correspondence of the Society. The President shall appoint, provide guidance for standing and special committees, not otherwise set forth in these Bylaws. The President shall be ex-officio member of every Indiana Society Committee except the Nominating Committee and is to perform such other duties as ordinarily pertain to this office, not otherwise covered in these Bylaws.
- C. VICE PRESIDENT: The Vice President shall assist the President in duties throughout the year and automatically assume the duties of the President in this officer's absence. The Vice President shall succeed to the office of President in case of a vacancy therein. The Vice President shall chair the Continuing Education committee and perform such other duties as ordinarily pertain to the office.

PROPOSED

- C. VICE PRESIDENT: The Vice President shall assist the President in duties throughout the year and automatically assume the duties of the President in this officer's absence. The Vice President shall succeed to the office of President in case of a vacancy therein. The Vice President shall chair the Continuing Education committee, *maintain and coordinate refreshments and supplies*, and perform such other duties as ordinarily pertain to the office.

ARTICLE XIV COMMITTEES

SECTION 1. STANDING COMMITTEES

There shall be twelve (12) Standing Committees: Membership; Budget and Finance; Bylaws and Standing Rules; Procedure Manual; Continuing Education; Certification; Eva I. Irwin, CMA (AAMA) Medical Assistant Program Fund; ISMA Liaison and Public Policy/Affairs; Ways and Means; Audit of Minutes, Financial Audit, and Credential Committee. Each of these committees shall perform the duties and services indicated by the name of the committee.

SECTION 1. STANDING COMMITTEES

There shall be <u>thirteen (13)</u> Standing Committees: Membership; Budget and Finance; Bylaws and Standing Rules; Procedure Manual; Continuing Education; Certification; Eva I. Irwin, CMA (AAMA) Medical Assistant Program Fund; ISMA Liaison and Public Policy/Affairs; Ways and Means; Audit of Minutes, Financial Audit, Credential Committee and <u>Mentoring</u>. Each of these committees shall perform the duties and services indicated by the name of the committee.

ARTICLE XIV COMMITTEES

SECTION 2. MEMBERSHIP AND APPOINTMENT OF STANDING COMMITTEES

Each Standing Committee shall, when feasible, consist of a chair and at least four (4) other members. The President shall appoint the Chair of Standing Committees, not otherwise provided for in these Bylaws. The appointments of these Standing Committees shall be announced at the post conference Board of Directors meeting. Members of the committees are to be chosen by the committee Chair.

SECTION 2. MEMBERSHIP, RECRUITMENT AND RETENSION

ISMA CODING CORNER

The Office of Inspector General (OIG) is an agency under the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services charged with the mission to protect the integrity of its programs as well as the health and welfare of beneficiaries of these programs, which includes Medicare and Medicaid. Each October, the OIG Annual Work Plan is published, outlining areas of concern within these programs that will be evaluated and investigated for wasteful spending, abuse, or fraud and compliance in the healthcare industry. Every healthcare provider and corporate entity that receives money from the Medicare Trust Fund should review areas in the annual work plan that may concern them.

During fiscal year 2017, OIG reported the following activity within healthcare programs:

Recovered funds: \$4.13 billion in investigative recoveries were recouped

Criminal actions: 881 individuals or entities were found guilty of crimes against Health and Human Services programs

Civil actions: Civil suits were brought against 826 individuals or entities for fraudulent activities.

Exclusion of 3,244 individuals and entities from participation in future federal healthcare programs

The following includes just a few of the initiatives under the 2018 OIG Work Plan:

Review of CMS systems used to pay Medicare Advantage Organizations

The medical necessity in patients' records for the "diagnosis or treatment of illness or injury or to improve the functioning of a malformed body member," in the prescription and billing of off-the-shelf orthotic devices (HCPCS codes L0648, L0650, and L1833). Since 2014, billing for these products has increased by 97 percent and allowed charges by 116 percent. One concern is these devices being supplied without an encounter with the referring physician within 12 months prior to the orthotic claim for reimbursement.

Potential abuse and neglect of elder and disabled Medicare beneficiaries treated at both inpatient and outpatient medical facilities, particularly in nursing/skilled nursing homes and group homes, as well as the in-home provided care.

Each year, the OIG has become more aggressive in attempts to reduce healthcare fraud. You can see why the OIG is referred to as the "federal watchdog." Much more information can be found at the OIG web site, www.oig.hhs.gov.
